15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The institution offers programs in multiple discipline like Commerce, Business Administration, Computer Application, Humanities and Social Work. The students study the electives in their final year. The college is affiliated to Bengaluru North University and study triple/double major subjects in the Humanities program. The New Education Policy was introduced from the current academic year which mandates the student to study one course from different discipline. The existing programs in many Universities/Institutes have limited number of Discipline Specific Electives and there are almost like core courses, hence wider choice of electives courses are proposed to be introduced in New Curriculum Framework. New curriculum helps the students to choose the courses from other streams/across Faculty. Therefore students will be capable of making a positive contribution to Commerce, Trade and industry in the national and global context by drawing the knowledge from the different disciplines, which is socially desirable. The college also has a Collaborative Inter Disciplinary Social Work Research Centre. This facilitates the faculty to carry out inter disciplinary research.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credit is a virtual/digital storehouse that contains the information of the credits earned by individual students throughout their learning journey. It will enable students to open their accounts and give multiple options for entering and leaving Colleges or Universities. There will be "multiple exits" and "multiple entries" points during the higher education tenure and credits will be transferred through ABC seamlessly. The institution is affiliated to Bengaluru North University and follows all the rules and regulations with regard to exams and results as set up by the University. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was followed until the academic year 2020-21. The CBCS does not require Academic Bank of Credit, as it does not have provisions for multiple entry and exits. The New Education Policy 2020 was implemented from the academic year 2021-22, only the NEP has the provision of multiple entry and exit points hence it requires Academic Bank of Credit. It is only a year since NEP was implemented and ABC has not been introduced yet. Hence whenever the University implements the

Academic Bank of Credit it will be introduced in the college.
17.Skill development:
<p>The college follows Choice Based Credit System, this curriculum includes skill development courses on language and communication skills, soft skills, life skills and computing skills. Also skill development activities are provided at the end of each course. There are also marks allotted in the internal assessment evaluation. The college has a business lab for purpose of conducting practical and online assignments. There is also language lab in which activities are conducted to improve their listening and speaking skills. There are well equipped Computer labs for developing computer programming skills. The New Education Policy has been implemented from this current year. The New curriculum has given more emphasis for the skill development by considering the need of the Fourth Industrial Revolution Components namely, Automation, Digital Platforms, AI Block Chain Technology, IOT, Spread sheet Analysis etc which enables the students to acquire the specialized skill and applied competencies in the field of commerce and business. In addition to this the college conducts add-on courses in specific fields to enhance the skills. The placement cell organizes programs on soft skills, technical skills and aptitude to boosts the chances of employability. The college invites experts from industry and academics to give guest lecture and conduct workshop on skill development programs.</p>
18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)
<p>The institution celebrates all the important Indian festivals and events of national importance. The college organizes cultural fest named "KAIIROS". This fest consists of all events based on Indian culture and traditions. Ethnic Day is celebrated aimed at celebrating different culture and ethnic communities. The students study Indian languages which is part of their curriculum. The college has a language lab in which students taught listening and communication skills of Indian languages. The syllabus also consist a paper on culture diversity and society. Yoga and meditation classes are conducted twice a week for the students. International Yoga Day is celebrated with different themes each academic year.</p>
19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):
<p>The institution imparts Outcome based education. The main aim of the colleges is to focus on outcome based education (OBE). Since the college is an affiliated one the University provides Graduate attributes. The University Curriculum also provide Program</p>

outcomes (PO'S) and Course outcomes (CO'S). Each department also drafts out the specific program outcomes including those which are provided by the University. The course outcomes are provided by the subject experts who work along with the faculty and based on the course outcomes provided by the University. The PO's and CO's are uploaded on the college website. While delivering subject to the students the main focus is on outcomes. With focus on outcome based education experts from industry and academics are invited to give guest lecture and conduct workshops. Practical sessions are conducted on specific topics to have hands on experience. The PO/CO attainment is calculated for the CIA at the end of every semester. The IQAC reviews the performance of students and gives recommendations and suggestions to Head of the Departments to improve on the quality of education provided to the students.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution has very good wi-fi connectivity and faculty and students benefit from it. Class room teaching involves video lectures, usage of ICT tools and so on. The faculty share course materials, video links, notes and assignments through their respective Whatsapp groups. Students' attendance, internal marks, notification and other details are sent through Pacifyca our ERP partner. All the events and programmes organized and conducted in the college are uploaded in the college website, which can be accessed by students from anywhere. Few Faculties upload their lecture videos on Youtube and share the links with the students where the students can access it anytime. If the syllabus cannot be completed for any reasons classes are taken online and revision is done for weaker students through online mode. Some Certificate courses are offered through online mode for the students. The videos of these lectures are uploaded on Youtube and the link are shared with the students.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The institution conducts internal assessment throughout the semester. The institution adopts Continuous Internal Evaluation to assess all aspects of a student's development in the institution. The results are constantly monitored by the class teacher to ensure consistent performance of the students. The internal tests are conducted for 40 marks, pre-final exams are conducted for 70 marks for the CBCS and for NEP internal test are conducted for 30 marks, pre-finals exams are conducted for 60 marks. For effective implementation of Continuous Internal Evaluation system at the institutional level, the institute conducts two unit tests and one pre-final exam per course each semester and performance based improvement test. Result Analysis is done by the class teachers after every CIE Test. The performance of the students is scrutinized by the Principal and the necessary feedback is given to the concerned faculty. And remedial classes are taken for the weaker students by the subject teachers in order to help them in to score good marks. The answer scripts are returned to the students after evaluation for their information and improvement, providing sufficient transparency and accountability. CIE final internal marks are displayed on the notice before uploading them in the university portal.

The college has adopted the Choice Based Credit System, which combines core and elective courses with foundational and soft skills training. The faculty at the college is highly qualified, committed, and knowledgeable. The faculty uses a variety of teaching techniques, including lectures, in-class presentations, remedial classes, practical laboratories, e-learning, and case studies. The institution uses a variety of strategies to close the knowledge gaps of the "weak" students so they can follow the learning curricula and to support, encourage, and reward "advanced learners." Students get the chance to participate in presentations, tests, documentaries, performances, discussions, charts, and other activities. The institution offers skill and career oriented short-term programs in Tally and Microsoft Excel and certificate courses in Basic Computers, Web Designing, Human Rights, Public Speaking etc.. The college has well Equipped laboratories and classrooms with overhead projectors.. The College has two computer labs with Internet connectivity available For the staff and students. Career guidance and placement facilities being provided to students and also been encouraging them to go for Education. Remedial classes are conducted on regular Basis especially for the slow learners and the students with less Attendance.

The college improves the quality of its use of various instructional techniques that will benefit students' overall results. The pandemic has taught everyone a lesson, especially in the educational field. Although it has affected us all severely, it has forced us to educate and learn using new ways and approaches. To Overcome these challenges and become successful technology users, instructors might benefit from researching the problems and challenges associated with ICT use in teaching and learning. This study's primary goal is to examine how instructors perceive the difficulties associated with using ICT in the classroom. The main problems and difficulties that were shown to be important when teachers used ICT tools were: limited accessibility and network connection, limited technical support, lack of efficient training, limited time, and lack of teachers' competency. Our institution offers a variety of teaching and learning methods, including online seminars and lectures, Google Meet classes, daily newspapers distributed to students in all streams by Deccan Herald, and classes that were taken during the pandemic that helped us cover a significant portion of the curriculum.

The college has a very organized, straight forward, and transparent system for Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) of students under study. The scheme of internal assessment is communicated via the academic calendar. The Bengaluru North University has assigned 30 marks for internal assessment. The marks are ear-marked in following ways

Attendance 5 marks

Assignment 5 marks

First Test 8 marks

Preparatory 12 mark

The first internal test is conducted after 6 weeks of commencement of every semester. The preparatory exams are conducted after 12 weeks of the semester. Assignments, projects, exhibitions and presentations are supervised between the first internal test and the preparatory exams. The classroom participation is evaluated continuously by their respective faculty. From the academic year 2021-2022 National education policy has been implemented. The internal marks calculations are:

The College, for fair, equivalent, and unbiased treatment of all students is ensured through the student grievance cell. To address any grievances pertaining to continuous assessment and the semester exams along with general grievance cell The students are provided the opportunity to raise their complaints including those connected with assessment at the grievance cell. The Cell, on getting a complaint, settles the issue within a limit of seven working days. Internal examinations are conducted and valued on a timely basis.
