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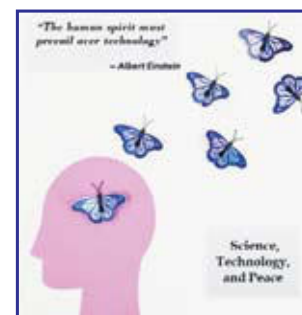
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## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

### STAN MEMORIAL LECTURE

Department of Social Work in association with the Journalism department organized "STAN MEMORIAL LECTURE" on 12-07-2022 from 11 am to 12.30 pm at PG block seminar hall. Theme of the programme was "I AM NOT A SILENT SPECTATOR". Programme commenced at 11 am with an invocation song by Journalism students. Ms. Sharmila, student from second year BSW welcomed the gathering. Programme was officially inaugurated by lighting the lamp by the dignitaries followed by Sradhanjali.



The chief guest of the programme was Dr. Fr. Joseph Xavier (Director, Indian Social Institute). Fr. Antony Mahendran (Manager of St Aloysius Institutions) set the context for the lecture and Sr. Deepa HoD of the department of Social Work introduced the speaker to the gathering.



In his lecture Fr. Joseph Xavier shared his memorable experience with Fr. Stan Swamy. They were together in many human rights movements. He made the participants to realise the struggles and hardships faced by Fr. Stan. He was a human rights activist breathed his last on July 2021, while in judicial custody in Taloja jail in Maharashtra. Charged under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act by National Investigation Agency (NIA) in connection with the Bheema Koregon violence case. He was arrested

on October 8th, 2020. Stan was the oldest person to be accused of terrorism in India. And he was suffering from Parkinson's disease had requested bail on medical grounds which was rejected multiple times.

Through his speech he has given a spark to the young minds. What is happened to Stan is not a single incident it is a border process that is taking places all over the country. Our prominent intellectuals, lawyers, writers, poets, activists, students they all are put in jail because they have expressed their dissent or raised questions about the Present government. And it is not going to stop today or tomorrow.

After the lecture students actively participated in the question and answer session. Principal of St. Aloysius college Dr. Sr. Sagayamary gave concluding remarks .Vote of thanks given by Mario Zindine . The programme was a remarkable achievement for the Department of Social Work & Journalism.

## WORLD DAY AGAINST TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS- 2022

World Day against Trafficking in Persons was observed on July 30th by the department of Social Work, Anti-Human Trafficking club and NSS unit in collaboration with Railway Protection Force(RPF). People trafficking and modern day slavery is a massive worldwide problem with very few countries immune to human trafficking being socially responsible our students too wanted to raise awareness and do their best to contribute towards building a just society where all can enjoy freedom and wellbeing.This year's theme focused on the role of technology as a tool that can both enable and impede human trafficking. She gave an insight to the students through her inspirational speech and added on that the Blood collected from the college will be stored in Victoria hospital blood bank.

The donated blood units is to be used for especially for women who are victims of any domestic violence or any acid attack/mainly for burnt cases in hospital. The collected blood is put in use to the poor and marginalized people in the society those who can't afford blood for burned treatment by paying money. Principal Sr Sagayamary honoured our chief guest with a memento and sapling. A group of doctors and nurses from Victoria hospital conducted the camp. The donors were asked to fill out a medical form to give details about their health related information. Certificates and refreshments, Lunch was provided to all the donors. Apart from students, HOD of social work department Sr. Deepa, Priyanka recetioptionist of the college and, other teachers and non-teaching staff of the college donated blood. Further. Sisters from Prema Mandira, Canossians also donated blood.

The students and teachers from Department of Social Work, NSS and NCC units, teaching and non-teaching staffs from St Aloysius College under the guidance of the Principal Dr. Sr. Sagaya Mary made the program a grant success .A total of 64 units of Blood was collected from the students.

In collaboration with Indian Social Institute and like-minded NGOs and Institutions various programs were planned and implemented at St. Aloysius by the Department of Social Work, NSS and Human Right Association, which provided all the participants first hand experience as well as awareness on what has to be done to promote human rights.

On 1st of December Human Right Week observation began with WhatsApp campaign wherein all the staff and students of the institution were asked to take a photo with the frame of 'Every Human has Rights' and all were requested to make that their WhatsApp display picture so as to spread the news that every human has rights. As the photos were clicked Red Ribbons were distributed by volunteers reminding everyone that as they wear the Red Ribbons they are reminded to respect the dignity of the victims of AIDS and respect them. Many students and all the staff were part of this program.

## HUMAN RIGHTS DAY INAUGURATION AT ST. JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

The inaugural program at St. Joseph's was hosted by Aloysius, the program was held in Xavier Hall from 3.00 PM to 5.30 PM. the chief guest of the day was Dr. Y.S.R Murthy, Founding Vice Chancellor of RV University, Bangalore, the program was presided over by Fr. Stan Swamy, Siddique Kappan, Shoma Sen etc. while the students sang 'Heal the world', candles were lit to remember all those great men and women who have given up their own comfort and pleasures of life to make the world a better place for everyone to live in. as the students continued to sing 'carry your candle' everyone were inspired to make their contribution to ensure that rights of everyone are respected and protected. The staff from ISI also were present to witness this solemn occasion.

## WALL CLOTH PAINTING

A wall cloth was displayed at the entrance of the college with the caption 'What is Right for you?' the purpose of this wall cloth writing was to make the students to know about their rights. The student community expects everyone to respect and ensure their rights, it was a challenge for them to understand just like they desire and demand rights everyone else's rights should be valued and protected. Many students came forward to write on the wall cloth, which expressed their desires, aspirations and thoughts on rights. Some of the thoughts also made the teachers wonder and think about the concept of right that the students have. However, it was a good exercise for the teachers and students to think about 'what is right' for each of them.

## PUBLIC PROGRAM ON HUMAN RIGHTS

A common program was organised for all the students and staff to celebrate Human Rights on 7th December 2022. The chief guest of the program was Mr. Manohar Ranganathan, Human Rights Activist and Executive Director of CARE, the guest of honour was Mr. Ezekiel Baskar, Humanitarian, Author and speaker. The special invitee for the day was Ms. Geeta Menon, Women Rights Activist and Co- founder of Stree Jagruti Samiti.

Dr. Sr. Sagayamary, the Principal welcomed the gathering and introduced the guest. The chief guest, Mr. Manohar spoke about Fundamental rights, Universal Declaration of Human Rights and practical implications of the human rights. Mr. Ezekiel Baskar, enlightend the students with the story of his life. He narrated about how his life as a teenager helped many farmers and how he has established the Blind Cricket Team. Ms. Geeta Menon spoke about the rights of everyone and she emphasised

on the rights of women. She reminded the students the sad situations about the violation of the rights of women beginning from their homes and ending up in a situation where they lose their dignity and honour. In his speech the Manager, Fr. Anthony Mahendran highlighted the importance of respecting everyone as the first step to uphold human rights.

## **PARTICIPATION IN SEMINAR ON HUMAN RIGHTS**

The staff and students of the college participated in a seminar on Human Rights, UPR and UDHR organized by SICHREM at Indian Social Institute ,Benson Town. Dr.Kanishka was the resource person for the seminar. The resource person highlighted Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) as a milestone document in the history of human rights. Drafted by representatives with different legal and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the world, the Declaration was proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in Paris on 10 December 1948 (General Assembly resolution 217 A) as a common standard of achievements for all peoples and all nations. It sets out, for the first time, fundamental human rights to be universally protected and it has been translated into over 500 languages. The UDHR is widely recognized as having inspired, and paved the way for, the adoption of more than seventy human rights treaties, applied today on a permanent basis at global and regional levels (all containing references to it in their preambles). The speaker also drew the understanding of the participants through a group discussion. He also elaborated on Human Rights as a career option. The session was very useful for the participants.

## NSS CAMP

### SOCIAL WORK CAMP

Social Work Camp is an integral part of the training program for the students pursuing Social Work Studies. The camp was conducted from 15th October to 22nd October at Doddasagarahalli, a village located in Devanahalli Taluka of Bangalore Rural District Karnataka. The students were given various responsibilities for the better functioning of the camp and the students were accommodated in different families of the village.

Several pilot visits were done to identify and understand the needs of the rural community. The interaction with the non- governmental organizations of the village helped the students to identify the issues faced by the villagers.



The camp was inaugurated on 15th October having Mr. Joseph, the Panchayath member from the village as the Chief Guest.



The occasion was also blessed by the presence of Rev. Fr. Arogyanathan, the Parish Priest of Karahalli, Mr. Arogyasamy and Sr. Manju, the social workers of the village. Activities were conducted to achieve the above objectives of the camp. Some of the activities which were performed during the camp include Lectures, Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA), Awareness Programs, Skit Play, Social Service, Cultural Programs etc.





On the second day, subgroups were created based on the size of the village and number of lanes, where in each group had at least one person who knows the local language and one who could draw well. They found out main seasons in the village and to identify the local words used to describe the seasons, they identified the different occupations of the villagers and in which season they have more work and which they have comparatively lesser, identified the crops grown in the village and understand its seasonal growth, identified the different festivals celebrated in the village and in which season it is celebrated and why, they identified the influential people in the village, these can be community leaders, panchayat leaders, school headmaster, ASHA worker, Anganwadi teacher etc.

The students also found out who were the wealthiest person in the village, identify at least three of them. They were also found out about the history of the village, identify any historical events in the village, example first shop, first school, medical center, establishment of anganwadi and the last major meeting held there.

On the third day and fifth day the students had first-hand experience of the life of the farmers. They worked with the farmers in various farms which helped them to know the problems faced by the farmers. On the fourth day and sixth day the students visited different villages and interacted with women specially those who are part of self-help groups which helped them to know about self-help groups in detail. The rural camp concluded with the valedictory program which was attended by all the people in the village and the influential people of the area. The cultural program was held as a token of appreciation for the villagers for welcoming the students to their village and providing opportunity to live among them. The children from the village also showcased their talents on that day. The Social Work students were able to excel in professional skills such as leadership, communication, team work, organization, coordination, cooperation, rapport building, reporting and so on. They were able to learn how to interact with the people and collect data from them as they were provided a golden opportunity to conduct a survey on socioeconomic and educational status of people at Doddasagarahalli. Overall the camp provided a very good experience on how the rural people live, their routine, their values and beliefs. The students also learned how to engage into an unknown community and the efforts and sacrifices to be carried out. This experience was far from theory, it fully accompanied reality.
